
A WELL... OR RATHER A CHASM...


THIS INCREDIBLE NATURAL CAVE 33 M IN DIAMETER AND 75 M DEEP STARTS TO TAKE SHAPE BEFORE YOUR VERY EYES.

You begin your exploration by going down in a lift or on foot, 103 m below the Earth's surface. Then you pass through a series of subterranean galleries until you reach the pier, from where you set off in a barge.

Suddenly, the river opens up into the Lac de la Pluie (Rain Lake), above which you will see the majestic and impressive Grande Pendeloque (Great Pendant), a 60 m high stalactite.

You then leave the boat and continue towards the Lac des Gours and the incredible Grand Dôme chamber, with its 94 m high vault which harbours a plethora of geological marvels that have been fashioned by nature over millions of years.









THE HISTORY OF THE GOUFFRE DE PADIRAC: A FEW DATES

1889

O9-10 JULY **Édouard-Alfred Martel**, equipped with heavy rope ladders and candles, **first enters the Gouffre de Padirac**,

at the time referred to as

the "Devil's hole".

WHEN ÉDOUARD-ALFRED MARTEL MADE HIS WAY INTO **ONE OF THE MOST MYSTERIOUS CAVES** EVER EXPLORED, HE QUICKLY WANTED
AS MANY PEOPLE AS POSSIBLE TO KNOW ABOUT WHAT HE HAD
DISCOVERED.

HE THEN PARTNERED WITH **GEORGE BEAMISH**, A DESCENDANT OF THE **IRISH FAMILY** OF BREWERS OF THE SAME NAME, TO FINANCE THE PROJECT. LONG MONTHS OF CONSTRUCTION WORK FOLLOWED UNTIL EVENTUALLY **IN 1898**, THE FIRST VISITORS MADE THEIR WAY DOWN INTO THE GOUFFRE DE PADIRAC.

1ST NOVEMBER

After nearly 10 years of colossal construction work, Gouffre de Padirac welcomes its first visitors.


1899

IN 2005, LÆTITIA DE MÉNIBUS-GRAVIER, GREAT, GREAT GRANDDAUGHTER OF GEORGE BEAMISH, TOOK OVER MANAGEMENT OF THE SITE, HERALDING A TURNING POINT IN ITS HISTORY. HER AIM WAS TO RESTORE THE IMAGE AND THE APPEAL OF THE CAVES – AN AIM THAT SHE SET ABOUT FULFILLING WITH BOUNDLESS ENERGY.

Spearheaded by her, the welcoming services were redesigned to provide an improved visitor experience.

The operating company now provides visitors with a programme of cultural and artistic events (editorial projects, photography exhibitions, recitals, events visits, etc.). It is still committed to providing everyone with access to France's leading natural underground heritage site. This involves bringing science and culture to as many people as possible, providing educational tools, digitising its archive so that everybody can access it via the Padirac media library and supporting charities.

Lætitia de Ménibus-Gravier constantly strives to **showcase** the cultural heritage of this natural underground monument and recently embarked on a project to overhaul and re-landscape the architecture of the reception facilities at the Gouffre de Padirac site, which – in 2019 – celebrated the 130th anniversary of its discovery.



1939

7 MAY

The "New Padirac" is opened in the presence of France's Minister for Public Works. This outstanding site and its facilities which are incredibly modern for the time get international press coverage.






LYRICAL, JAZZ & THEATRE ARTS


